THEME: Ending cervical cancer within a few generations.

This is a summary of the proceedings of the Regional Cervical Cancer Awareness Meeting which was held on the 27th of January 2023 at Bronte Hotel with a total of 58 guests. The event's main objective was to raise awareness about cervical cancer treatment, prevention, screening, and diagnosis by ending cervical cancer within a few generations. MIC Radiology Group organized the webinar with its partners Cancer Care Network Zimbabwe, Hope 4 Cervix, and Dr. Guzha Clinic.

Dr. Guzha presented about cervical cancer prevention, screening, and diagnosis in the 21st century. He said the main cause of cervical cancer is HPV which stands for human papillomavirus and it has different types. It also causes some other genital cancers in women and men including vaginal, vulva, penile, and anal cancer. It's very common so anyone who is sexually active can get it.

Doctor Chatora presented the role of imaging in cancer treatment. Imaging is used to help find and diagnose disease, recommend treatments, and monitor how well patients respond to therapy, in cancer screening ultrasound and MRI are mainly used to determine surgical staging.

The staging system, then determines the treatment pathway that the patient goes down so it has to be done with a high degree of accuracy. Treatment should be made on the basis of accurate imaging. Whether we're using MRI or ultrasound but basically MRI has been shown to be the best.

Dr. Tsikai started by highlighting that cancer is emerging as a major public health concern in Sub-Saharan Africa and is expected to double in the next twenty years. (WHO). In Zimbabwe, cancer is a major cause of morbidity and mortality with over 7800 new cases annually and more than 2000 deaths each year. (ZNCR 2018).

Dr. Kufa presented about cervical cancer in women living with HIV. She highlighted that CC is highly preventable but many women are dying every 2 minutes worldwide from CC. Sub-Saharan Africa has got a high incidence and mortality of cervical cancer and as well as HIV. She said HPV infection tends to persist in women living with HIV and even when they're diagnosed with cancer and are treated, they do not perform well as their HIV-negative counterparts. She also highlighted that Zimbabwe is one of the countries with a high burden of HIV and our prevalence is about 11.8% and which is among the highest in the world.











## Cervical Cancer Awareness Outreach.

MIC Radiology Group together with ZWDA' and Cancer Care Network Zimbabwe went for a cervical cancer awareness outreach on Saturday the 28th of January 2023 at Hatcliffe Poly Clinic. Bringing awareness of cervical cancer amongst the community of Hatcliffe Extension through screening, awareness material, and informative talks and to making the community aware that 'cervical cancer' was the number one cancer amongst women in Sub-Saharan Africa in particular Zimbabwe.



The following partners attended the event. Cabs, Cancer Care Network Zimbabwe, City of Harare, Delta, Dr Audrey Chivaura, Dr Guzha, Hatcliffe Polyclinic, Hatcliffe Community Committee, MIC Radiology Group, Miracle Missions, MRI & Radiology Centre, Newlands Clinic, New Start Centre, Old Mutual, Pedigree Events, Population Services Health, Radiation Protection Authority of Zimbabwe, Rooneys Hire, Rusty Markham, Trade Centre, Spar, Star FM, Cervical Cancer Survivors, ZBC, ZiFM, Zimbabwe Women Doctors Association, and ZLG.

A total of 11 doctors and 3 nurses volunteered their services. The screening was set from 9.00 am to 12.00 pm but had to be extended to 12.30 by which time the following services were offered:

- 125 consults with doctors
- 70 hpv gene screening
- 20 viac's
- · 4. HIV testing and STI treatments offered




This is a summary of the proceedings of the RPAZ Awareness Drive which was held on the 10th of February 2023 at RPAZ Offices in Avondale with a total of 58 guests. The event's main objective was to raise awareness about cervical cancer treatment, prevention, screening, and diagnosis by ending cervical cancer within a few generations.

Dr. Tsikai addressed challenges that are faced on a daily basis and also hoped to find for women to come for early screening before they become symptomatic. Cancer treatment is very costly, patients are paying up to \$20 000 U.S. dollars for treatment. Surgery and radiotherapy in private hospitals are not affordable. Even patients on medical aid are paying huge shortfalls. Other challenges she addressed are below:

- Cancer services remain highly centralized (barrier to access)
- Out-of-pocket financing for cancer services
- Limited radiotherapy services in the public sector (only brachytherapy service available in government institutions)
- Frequent radiotherapy machine breakdowns in the public sector are complicated by very high repair and maintenance fees
- Loss of skilled cancer health personnel to greener pastures (skills flight)
- The preference for alternative therapies (herbal medicines) by a significant number of cancer patients leading to delayed presentation and poor outcomes

Mrs Simbanegavi explained about PSH which provides HIV-integrated services through new start centres. We provide HIV testing we provide pre-exposure prophylaxis (prep). We also do STI management be it screening to family planning services. She said they introduced a vehicle cancer screening. They also provide voluntary male medical circumcision. She also ad dressed cancer screening methods that they were going to use to screen female workers at RPAZ. And she finished by contacting cervical cancer screening tests on ladies.

Miss Fortue explained about Pamumvuri Trust and how they deal with mental health. She said struggling with mental health can start at any time when you are diagnosed with cancer, it affects her psychology, it affects him or her psychologically, and it also affects the people around her psychologically and, in most cases, people will end up discriminating him or her. It could be after diagnosis, during treatment, or after treatment has finished. Your experiences can vary. This can depend on your circumstances. A cancer diagnosis can affect people with an existing mental health problem in different ways. Some people might feel their mental health worsens with a cancer diagnosis. Others might feel it doesn't change much. Your feelings can change at any time during or after treatment. She also encouraged people to be gentle to be who show mental health disorders



ZWDA in partnership with the ministry of health and Mutemwa leprosy centre commemorated the first-ever world leprosy day celebrations on 11 February 2023 from 7 AM to 4 PM at Mutemwa in Mutoko. #### **ZWDA Financial Literacy Breakfast Workshop**


